



CERTIFICATE OF FLAME RESISTANCE

Rose Brand is in business in New York, New York, with headquarters in Secaucus, New Jersey and offices also in California.

The IFR (Inherently Flame Retardant) fabric described below meets the minimum requirements of flame resistance established by the following tests:

- NFPA 701 (2004 ed.), test method #1
- Calif. Title 19, #1237, small scale test
- ASTM E-84 (2011): Earned a Class A rating
- CAN/ULC S-109-03 for vertical fabrics
- BS 5438 Test 2 (Type B) for vertical fabrics
- IMO A.471 for public spaces on cruise ships

Woven with *non-combustible fibers*, this fabric is inherently and permanently flame resistant for the life of the fabric. This flame resistance will NOT wash out. When properly maintained the flame resistant condition will remain unchanged.

Over time, however, accumulations of dust and air-borne oils can diminish the flame resistance of this fabric. Cold water washing with gentle detergent followed by air drying will restore any lost flame retardance.
